



- 1. Prayers for God's blessings on this ministry.
- 2. Cash donations to pay for shipping (one box costs \$11) (Make any checks payable to Orphan Grain Train)
- 3. Infant supplies: Cloth and Disposable Diapers, Layettes, Stuffed toys
- 4. School supplies: Backpacks, new coloring books and crayons, pens and pencils, writing paper and notebooks, sports equipment such as balls, bats, gloves and uniforms.


