
Sunday, July 4



Reason #8

Tithing Helps Us Overcome Selfishness

By nature, we are selfish people. Because of our selfishness, we look at life in terms of <u>our</u> money, <u>our</u> things, and <u>our</u> achievements. We focus on <u>ourselves</u> and give little thought to those around us.



A selfish attitude is obviously not conducive to giving. Believing that we need and deserve all we have, we have little desire to give generously. Because of our sinful, self-oriented natures, we fail to exercise generosity in our daily lives. The Bible depicts our fallen condition: "...for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). We want to accumulate things only for ourselves, and our society does little to redirect our focus. The media rarely applaud selfless acts of giving. Instead, admiration is saved for men and women who have attained power, prestige, and material wealth.

By the working of the Holy Spirit through His Word, God can remove our selfishness. No longer is selfishness an obstacle to our giving. With hearts right with God, we acknowledge God as the owner of all things and trust in Jesus rather than our money for our sense of self-worth, our security, and our salvation.

Because of God's grace given freely to us, we don't have to continue living as selfish people. We can become detached from our money. By God's grace, appropriated to us through Word and Sacrament, we are transformed in our thinking. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). God transforms us from selfish people who hoard our blessings to generous people who give freely. Only God is capable of removing the hindrance of selfishness to our giving so we can give our tithes week after week.

Prayer: Dear Heavenly Father, I thank You for the power of Your Word that changes me from a selfish to a generous person. Help me to stay motivated to read and meditate continually on Your Word. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.



Coronavirus (COVID-19) Funeral Assistance

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

FEMA is providing financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.



To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to or caused by COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national or qualified alien.

Which expenses will qualify for reimbursement?

Examples of eligible expenses for funeral services and interment or cremation may include, but not limited to:

- Transportation for up to two people to identify the deceased individual
- The transfer of remains, a casket or urn
- · A burial plot or cremation niche
- A marker or headstone

- Clergy or officiant services
- The arrangement of a funeral ceremony
- The use of funeral home equipment or staff
- Cremation or interment costs
- Costs associated with producing multiple death certificates

What information do I need to provide to FEMA?

Please have the following information before contacting FEMA to apply:

- Your name, social security number, date of birth, mailing address and contact phone numbers.
- The name, social security number and date of birth for each deceased individual.
- The location or address where the deceased individual passed away.
- Documentation and receipts for any assistance already received from other sources, including burial or funeral insurance, donations, voluntary agencies, other government programs or non-profit organizations.
- If you and another person both incurred funeral expenses for the same deceased individual(s), you can
 also provide that person as a co-applicant include their name, social security number and date of birth
 on the application.




