Because of the Pandemic, our Senior Retreat Scheduled for 2020, was rescheduled for 2021. This is to inform you that the Southern Illinois District and the Missouri District will hold the 19th Lutheran Older Adult Retreat on October 20 (Wednesday) and October 21 (Thursday) at the Pere Marquette Lodge & Conference Center in Grafton, II. Reason # 10

Jesus Upheld the Practice of Tithing

In contrast to the Old Testament where tithing is often referenced, tithing is rarely mentioned in the New Testament. Matthew 23:23 is one of two occasions when Jesus mentions the tithe. "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the



others." Jesus also refers to tithing in the Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector which is found in Luke 18:9-14.


While Jesus doesn't criticize the practice of tithing, He is critical of those who use tithing to excuse themselves from practicing justice, mercy, and faithfulness. While affirming the tithe in Matthew 23:23, He is really exhorting the Pharisees to examine their motives. When we tithe out of love and gratitude for our Savior, we honor the Lord. If we tithe out of duty or as a way to earn our salvation, the tithe is a meaningless, empty gesture. Apart from a relationship with Jesus built on faith; tithing has no value in God's sight. "And without faith it is impossible to please Him" (Hebrews 11:6). God wants us to give our gifts and offerings to Him out of a love response. Old Testament believers tithed under the Law; New Testament Christians tithe under grace out of a love response to our Savior. With the proper motive of love for God Who gave His only Son, the tithe acts only as a benchmark or a guide for our proportionate giving. However, nowhere in the New Testament does it suggest that we are to give less than the tithe. We give, not to fulfill a legal requirement, but out of love for Jesus.

Because of what Jesus did on the Cross for each of us, our attitudes change from a "got to" give to a "want to" give. Through faith and trust, many of us will not only tithe but give beyond the tithe. Jesus said, "Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required..." (Luke 12:48).

Prayer: Dear Jesus, grant me a giving and generous heart. Help me loosen the grip on my money. I pray that my generosity will give You honor and glory. I ask this in the name of Jesus Christ my Lord. Amen.

Freedom from Slavery

Our Christian moral convictions are under attack today primarily by the new religion, which has been imposed upon us by our cultural elites: the religion of free sex. What I mean is that every sexual practice must now be accepted within our culture today. It may not be disapproved of in any way. Indeed, it must be lauded and encouraged. To disapprove of any sexual act in our culture today is tantamount to a religious heresy. And you know what happens to heretics.

The freedom of which Christ speaks in John 8 is not the freedom to do as we desire. It is not the freedom of tolerationism. Indeed, what our world calls freedom is in fact a horrifying and insidious form of slavery. What our world calls freedom is to be enslaved to sin and depravity. How odd to call the very thing that enslaves a freedom! Yet this is extremely common in our culture. We mis-name

for the hope of righteousness. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through love. (ESV)

many things. Take for example, the "Affordable Care Act;" which is neither affordable nor does it provide better medical care. Are we also so foolish as to confuse sin and freedom, so that one is called the other? Perhaps so, much to our shame.

Have you ever wondered if a pig thinks it's free? How would the animal fed unto slaughter in small pens, living with their own filth know whether they were free or captive? He never sees beyond this very small world. The hog is free to eat, sleep, and perhaps copulate. This is the same thing that our world calls freedom, I think.

How could we go back to this slavery to sin, since we have been freed by our God who has opened paradise through the precious blood of Jesus our Lord, reconciled us to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility and putting to death the lust that makes us enemies of God and abusers of each other. How could we go back?! "Thanks be to God, that we who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which we were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness" (Rm 6:17–18). Paul is turning over the word "slave;" harnessing it for the purposes of true freedom. We have become slaves of God, who frees His slaves from their depraved lives by offering His Son for them, and He draws them to Himself. takes them into His arms and blesses them by baptism and through the Son they become sons. The pigs are pigs no more! I am glad of such slavery where the master dies for the slave and makes him a son.

As the Johann Heerman hymn says of the cross of our Lord:

What punishment so strange is suffered yonder! The Shepherd dies for sheep that loved to wander:

The Master pays the debt His servants owe Him, Who would not know Him (LSB 439:4)?

Here is a freedom full of gratitude that will return to the neighbor faithful service to the Ten Commandments in full thanksgiving to God. As Luther said, "The Christian bears and holds with [the neighbor] what he is not obliged to do. But this he does freely, for he is certain that this is pleasing to God also, and he does it gladly, accepts it as any other free work which presents itself without his selecting it, because he desires and seeks no more than to do in faith the works which are pleasing to God." Here is freedom from slavery to the world.

"Let us learn to place a high value on this freedom of ours; not the emperor, not an angel from heaven, but Christ, the Son of God, through whom all things were created in heaven and earth, obtained it for us by His death, to set us free, not from some physical and temporary slavery but from the spiritual and eternal slavery of those most cruel and invincible tyrants, the law, sin, death, the devil, etc., and to reconcile us to God the Father. Now that these enemies have been defeated and now that we have been reconciled to God through the death of His Son, it is certain that we are righteous in the sight of God and that all our actions are pleasing to Him; and if there is any sin left in us, this is not imputed to us but is forgiven for the sake of Christ. Paul is speaking very precisely when he says that we should stand in the freedom for which Christ has set us free (Gal 5:1). Therefore, this freedom is granted to us, not on account of the law or our righteousness but freely, on account of Christ. Paul testifies to this and demonstrates it at length throughout this epistle; and Christ says in John 8: 'If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed' (Jn 8:36). He alone is thrust into the middle between us and the evils that oppress us. He conquers and abolishes them, so that they cannot harm us any longer. In fact, in place of sin and death He grants us righteousness and eternal life, and He changes slavery and the terrors of the law into the freedom of conscience and the comfort of the gospel, which says: 'Take heart, my

son; your sins are forgiven' (Mt 9:2). Therefore, he who believes in Christ has this freedom."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

We thank you for your service and dedication to the mission and ministry of sharing God's great love with so many; students and families, throughout this difficult pandemic.

St. Paul wrote to the Ephesians in chapter 4:1-7, "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call – one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.
