

Beware of Faith Decay

A message on a billboard sponsored by the local dental association reads, "IGNORE YOUR TEETH AND THEY WILL GO AWAY."

What happens when you ignore your teeth? When you stop brushing, flossing, eating the right foods and having regular checkups? Foreign materials get lodged in your teeth and cause them to begin to rot – tooth decay.

The deceptiveness of tooth decay is that it doesn't show up the minute you stop brushing. True, the rotting begins immediately, but its effects aren't seen for a period of time. You can smile into a mirror for a long time and never notice anything wrong. Until.... Until one day your teeth begin to hurt and you may find that they are beyond repair. "Ignore your teeth and they will go away."

The same is true of your faith. Ignore it and it will go away. When you stop confessing and repenting of your sins, looking to Jesus for His cleansing forgiveness; when you stop applying the Word of God, which is given to feed and build up your faith; when you stop regularly participating in the fellowship of the saints, you are opening yourself to the rotting effect of sin. Faith decay has set in.

This rotting effect begins immediately. However, many people continue to think they are Christians long after they have ceased to be "in the faith" (2 Corinthians 13:5). And they continue to go through life smiling merrily without any thoughts about forgiveness, Jesus, or His church. Until....until their lives begin to hurt from the rotting effects of sin. And for some, they had so hardened their hearts against Jesus that they could no longer respond to His sweet voice calling, or His knocking at the door of their hearts (Revelation 3:20). They perished because they had let their faith decay beyond repair.

How about you? Is your faith being reflected in your life? Are you talking to God each day in prayer, reading His Word, letting Him talk to you? Are you gathering with others to thank and praise Him for all His blessings? Are you strengthening the weak, visiting the sick, comforting the widows, sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with others? In other words, are you living the Christian life? Or are you saying "Wait" or "Let others do it"?

It is not yet too late. Through this tract Jesus is again knocking at the door of your heart. His voice whispers sweetly of love, forgiveness, cleansing, new life, eternal assurance. His voice is once again calling to you to open up to Him, receive His forgiveness, receive His life. Listen to Him! Share once again in the fellowship of the saints. Let Him restore the joy of your salvation even in the midst of this fearful and troubled world. Rejoice in the Lord, for His love and mercy are everlasting.




